

Neighbourhood Tasking

Working together to make your Neighbourhood cleaner, greener and safer.

Wolverhampton now has Neighbourhood Tasking meetings operating in all 15 of its Local Neighbourhood Partnership areas.

Neighbourhood Tasking brings together a variety of local service providers to improve the area by tackling various problems ranging from tackling graffiti and vandalism to dealing with hot spot areas for crime and anti social behaviour.

Neighbourhood Tasking responds to residents concerns in the neighbourhood by bringing together agencies such as the Police, Local Neighbourhood Partnership teams, Fire Service, Wolverhampton Homes and key Council services to jointly tackle local issues as quickly as possible.

Neighbourhood Tasking groups are busier than ever sharing local intelligence and tackling local problems which are blighting a great City to live and work in. Since April 2009 Neighbourhood Tasking groups have received 230 neighbourhood issues and have achieved a 95% completion rate* of tackling these problems.

Tasking groups across the City want people of Wolverhampton to know that

'Wolverhampton is, and will continue, to deal with those problems which can make life a misery'

There are a number of great examples showcasing the success of these tasking groups, but here is a sample to give some flavour of what has been achieved:-

- Whitmore Reans tasking identified a street in need of Deep Street Cleaning. Working as a partnership the various agencies took to the street to improve the area.'
- Long Knowle Park residents in Wednesfield were facing problems with young people using the park to consume alcohol and abuse drugs, deterring young children from utilising the area. As a response the Neighbourhood Tasking group facilitated the installation of improved lighting to the park, enabling the police to erect a domehawk CCTV and also see the young people (who had previously been hidden) from passing patrols. Detached youth work was also carried out.
- Bilston North tasking carried out a successful Moto operation (mini motorbikes) and crushed bikes that were seized
